

European Union Law and Policies

Professor in charge: Aline Beltrame de Moura Year/type of study: 1st cycle (Undergraduate)

Period: August to December 2020

The course aims to examine European Union policies and law in order to understand how this process of regional integration has become the main reference in terms of integrationist policies in the world and what challenges it is currently facing given the geopolitical changes that have taken place in recent years due to the economic and financial crisis and the intense migratory flow in the region. The course seeks to unite theory and reality through the use of a methodology that combines the theoretical exposition of the professor with the participation in debates and discussions generated from news brought by the students and that have been conveyed by the media over that week.

The course offers a multidisciplinary view of the European phenomenon, analysing not only the legal aspects of integration, but also economic and political elements that together constitute what we now understand as the European Union. In the short term, the impact of offering this module is to promote the dissemination of the knowledge on the European subjects to the students, instigating them to deep their studies through the writing of research papers on the subject and the participation in groups of research. In the long term, the course intends to stimulate these students to further their studies in this area at master's and PhD level. In addition, the module will provide the necessary basis for students to undertake academic exchanges at one of the more than 100 European Universities that are accredited to the Law Undergraduate Program.



International Private law and European Procedural Law

Professor in charge: Aline Beltrame de Moura Year/type of study: 3rd cycle (Postgraduate)

Period: June to September 2019

The course intends to provide students with critical knowledge on the general problems of the subject matter and on the different methods used, in order to offer them a whole view of the European private international law system, particularly, the recent and important developments of the European Union law in this area.

The impact of the study of the Europeanization of private international law turns out to be relevant not only because it is a channel of disseminating and for deepening the knowledge on this subject among Brazilian professionals, enabling them to eventually act in the European market, but also because it contributes to the improvement of the Mercosur system.

The Module has allowed UFSC to deliver courses on different levels, from undergraduate to postgraduate programs.

E-BOOK PUBLICATION: "EUROPEAN PRIVATE INTERNATIONAL LAW: BETWEEN HARMONIZATION AND FRAGMENTATION"

The CCJ/UFSC Jean Monnet Module launched the book "Private European International Law: between harmonization and fragmentation" The studies presented were carefully prepared by professors from Brazil and abroad, specialists in themes of private international and EUROPEAN law, involving fifteen partner universities and research institutes, seven of which are foreigners.

The book was produced with funding obtained from the European Commission under the Jean Monnet Module instituted at the Center for Legal Sciences at the Federal University of Santa Catarina, Project (600067-EPP-1-2018-1-BR-EPPJMO-MODULE). The CCJ/UFSC Jean Monnet Module actions aim to promote excellence in



teaching, research, and extension in the field of European Union studies worldwide, encouraging the publication and dissemination of academic research.

The present effort, therefore, proposes to disseminate the results of the studies promoted by the research projects developed by the CCJ/UFSC Jean Monnet Module, which aims to analyze the increasing normative regulation of private relations that have elements of strangeness on the part of the institutions of the European Union and the challenges faced for the regional harmonization of these norms of private international law. The researches presented here attempt to lead the reader to reflect on the new directions and challenges about the contours and transformations of private international law today, taking into account the particularities and potentialities of its regulation at the national, international level and before the processes of regional integration.

Certainly, the European Union fosters a movement towards uniformity at the regional level, once it has developed, over the past few years, an enviable range of regulations. These rules are meant to promote the regulation not only of connection standards but also of material rules that solve international problems which affect individuals who move freely in the European area of freedom, security, and justice.
